Behaviour Policy

At Colney Heath we have a behaviour ladder. Our emphasis is on reinforcing the positive to promote good behaviour.

	Actions	Examples of Seen Behaviour
Golden Sunshine Outstanding behaviour	Golden Sunshine Award presented in assembly and taken home. Name goes up on Golden Sunshine display	Showing respect to others – adults and children. Outstanding role model at all times to others in class. Actions above and beyond.
Yellow Sun Continuous good behaviour	Good behaviour recognised and praise given Team points / stickers / marbles given.	Supporting other children's learning. Continuous good behaviour. Politeness and thinking of others.
Blue Sky Expected Behaviour	Recognition in class of expected behaviour Non verbal encouragement also given.	Expected behaviour. Sitting listening. Following instructions. On task. Responding well to adults.
Grey Cloud Disrupting teaching and learning	Non verbal reminder given Reminder and verbal warning given three times Child will Lose a playtime and complete a Think Sheet to understand choices in their behaviour.	Disrupting teaching & learning. Talking at inappropriate time. Distracting others. Not responding to adults. Rudeness/disrespect.
Storm Cloud Isolated incidents Continuation of Grey Cloud behaviour	Time out of classroom in another class, completion of a Think Sheet and a missed playtime A letter is sent home informing parents of incident Three Storm Cloud letters in half a term will result in a meeting	Isolated serious incident (physical) Continuing grey cloud behaviour. Lack of cooperation Extreme rudeness
Lightning Bolt Racism, persistent bullying, excessive violence,	A phone call home is made to arrange a meeting with parents. An Internal exclusion will result Three lightning bolts in half a term will result in a Fixed Term Exclusion. Permanent Exclusion or Managed Move will be considered. Instant exclusions may be necessary if it is deemed appropriate by the head teacher	Racism, persistent bullying, Excessive violence in response to a non-violent incident Persistent non-cooperation. dangerous behaviour

Decisions are made as early as possible and are based on professional judgements taking into account the full circumstances at the time as well as the age and need of the pupils involved.
