Literacy


We are kickstarting our term with Alice in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll

In D and T we are learning about mechanisms including levers.


Science


In Science, our topic is Animals and Humans We are especially learning about different types of skeletons-endo and exo skeletons....



and next half term we are looking at a book about plastic pollution called Stella and the Seagull.








In Art we are looking at printing techniques looking at an artist called John Fellows who loves mountains, valleys and nature.

Reading at Home

The first thing we do each morning when we come in is to look at the writing we have done the previous day, we correct and fix mistakes such as spellings or grammar errors. While the registers are being done, your child should also get out their reading book and read. Mrs Franklin also goes round with her trusty clipboard checking each child's reading records. It is expected that your child reads a minimum of 4x a week. Please help your child to be 'Book ready' each morning. They also have a chance to change books during this time.

Reminders

- Please label EVERYTHING! We nearly always have a spare tshirt or pair of shorts that we can't find an owner of after each PE lesson. Talking of PE, this is on a TUESDAY and THURSDAY. Too many children still do NOT have their PE kit in school on these days. They also need to be suitably equipped to go outside.

Home learning looks like this.....

Reading

• In KS2 it is expected that your child reads at least 4 times a week. Reading is, put simply, the key to learning. We hear children read through guided reading and some one to one reading, especially for children that find it difficult, but if there is one single thing you can do, it is to hear your child read. Please make sure you record their reading in the orange reading record!

Spellings

They are based on our spelling scheme and are a mix of year 2 words (revising) as well as learning some of the year 3 and 4 common exception words. The list will be stuck into your child's reading record, so please make sure it is in school every day. I will also put the whole half term's spellings on the class website page. Please do help your child to learn them.

<u>Maths</u>

 Don't forget to do TT Rockstars. Your child has their own login so please have a look at this. Ideally this should be done daily or at least 4x a week.
 Certificates are given out in assembly for those that are doing it regularly. By the power of a few buttons I can check who is/is not doing it.
