<u>Curriculum</u> Following the EYFS framework our curriculum is planned to support your unique child's needs and interests. We also base learning experiences around the seasons, using rhymes and stories inside and out to encourage children to notice, enquire and develop their natural curiosity. Our first enquiry based question is 'I wonder why the leaves are falling'.	Communication and Language Listening and responding to ideas expressed by others in conversation or discussion. Listening attentively to stories, anticipating key events and commenting on what they have heard. Maintaining attention, concentration and sitting quietly during small group carpet time. Developing talk and new vocabulary through play.	Personal. Social and Emotional Development Being a good friend. Turn taking and sharing. Expressing our feelings. Using our manners. Being good at tidying up and looking after our environment. How to stay safe and healthy. School Value: Be Kind
How can you help? Children will take two library books home each Friday please read and discuss the story with your child. After asking questions about the story, ask your child what they saw, what happened, and what could happen next. Encourage their mark making skills, forming lines and circles, or if they are ready letters from their name.	Physical Development Develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills. Using a pencil and other tools effectively. Considering ways to keep healthy and safe, eat healthy foods and look after our bodies. Developing how to manage basic hygiene and personal care needs themselves successfully, including dressing and going to the toilet.	Literacy Phase 1 phonics begins daily with developing listening skills, then moving onto hearing words that rhyme. We will read, share and enjoy new and familiar stories. Begin to take part in fine motor skills activities, so that they can gain control when writing, drawing and painting. Recognise their name and begin to form letters.
Encouraging them to notice colours, shapes, features and things that match. Talking about amounts, sizes and comparing. Talk with your child about what they see around them. Go for walks, collect acorns, conkers and leaves. Ask them how things feel and wonder what can they hear? Chat and encourage them to talk as much as possible.	Mathematics Noticing - Making them aware of maths around them. Commenting on features and shapes. Naming and matching items. Sorting objects, into chosen groups and groups of the children's choosing. Comparing amounts Comparing sizes.	Understanding the World Notice, talk about and celebrate difference. Develop their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials. Notice changes in the natural world. Learning about ourselves and our families. Learning about other families customs and celebrations.




