

Curriculum

Following the EYFS framework our curriculum is planned to support your unique child's needs and interests. We also base learning experiences around the seasons, using rhymes and stories inside and out to encourage children to notice, enquire and develop their natural curiosity.

How can you help?

Children will take two library books home each Friday please read and discuss the story with your child. After asking questions about the story, ask your child what they saw, what happened, and what could happen next.

Continue to borrow story sacks to enjoy together.

Helping your child to form letter shapes from their name. To control the pencil holding it correctly.

Encouraging them to notice colours, shapes, features and things that match. Talking about amounts, sizes and comparing. Talk with your child about what they see around them. Go for walks, ask them how things feel and wonder what can they hear? Chat and encourage them to talk as much as possible. Try using 'I wonder why' questions to extend their thinking and language skills.

Welcome

Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year and welcome back to the start of a brand new term at Colney Heath Nursery. We hope that everyone had a restful winter break. Your children have developed positive relationships with their peers and the team and we are looking forwards to enjoying new learning opportunities, nurturing individual interests, while having lots of fun!

Communication and Language

- Listening to a variety of fiction and non-fiction books.
- Remembering key facts or parts of a story.
- Paying attention to more than one thing at a time.
- Showing an understanding of why questions to share our knowledge and understanding.
- Singing a large repertoire of songs and rhymes.
- Continuing to develop turn taking in conversation.

Physical Development

- Developing our movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.
- Using large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.
- Controlling a ball with feet.
- Continuing to develop our grip when using one handed tools and equipment.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Developing our sense of responsibility and membership in a community.
- Becoming increasingly independent in dressing.
- Playing with one or more other children, extending and elaborating imaginative play ideas.
- Thinking about how others feel and what we can do if someone is unhappy or sad.

<u>Literacy</u>

- Learning initial sounds; s,a,t,p,i,n,m, d,g,o,c,k,e (please check tapestry and your child's pack of sounds to keep up with these as we learn).
- Identifying rhyming words.
- Developing oral blending and segmenting skills (hearing the individual sounds in b-u-n and linking those with the word bun).
- Using some of their print and letter knowledge in early writing in labels, lists and notes.
- Developing the correct formation of the letters in their name.


Mathematics

- Making comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.
- Linking numerals and amounts. For example, showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5.
- Talking about and identifying patterns around us.
- Talking about and exploring 2D and 3D shapes.

Understanding the World

- Learning the names of new animals, places and things in the local and wider environment, particularly penguins and polar bears.
- Talking about the different types of weather we notice.
- Observing and questioning the changes in our environment, focusing on seasons and plants.
- Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences.


