		<div></div>		Mezuzah	A small case made from wood, metal, pottery or plastic used to remember God. Nailed to the upper right of the door ...
				Mezuzah scroll	It is a piece of parchment called a Klaf with specific Hebrew verses the Shema from the Torah.
				Liberal Judaism	Is an authentic and modern form of Judaism, rooted in a deep and meaningful engagement with Jewish texts, values, ...
				Progressive Judaism	Or non-orthodox Judaism believes that Judaism should change over time to be relevant to people
				Shema	One of the most important Jewish prayers, contained in the mezuzah
				Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement)	It is the holiest day of the year in Judaism. Its central themes are atonement and repentance.

Shabbat	It is the Hebrew word for Sabbath, which Jewish people mark from nightfall on Friday night until nightfall				
10 commandments	The Ten Commandments are the fundamental laws of the Jews which tell the Jewish people how they should live. Many countries base their laws on these rules too.				
Trinity	One person in 3 - God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit
