Buildings burnt quickly because they were made of wood and thatch and it had been a hot, dry summer. The houses were close together so the fire spread quickly. People tried to stop the fire spreading by creating firebreaks or using firefighting equipment. Many people were made homeless and much of London was destroyed. We know about the fire from artefacts such as bricks, paintings, songs and diary entries from people who witnessed the fire. After the fire, buildings had to be made of brick and roads were made wider to stop fires from getting out of control.
