

			Justice and Fairness	While justice usually has been used with reference to a standard of rightness, fairness often has been used with regard to an ability to judge without reference to one's feelings.
			Charities	The UK Charities Act says that a 'charity' is an institution which is established for charitable purposes only and is subject to the control of the High Court's charity law jurisdiction (Christian Aid, Islamic Relief, Oxfam and other local charity groups)
			Zaccheus the Tax Collector	Zaccheus, a cheating tax collector who climbs a tree to see Jesus, and later changes to become a follower of Christ.
			Widow's Mite	Is a small contribution that is willingly given and is all one can afford.
			Charitable work Muslims need to support during Ramadan	Zakat is an Islamic finance term referring to the obligation that an individual has to donate a certain proportion of wealth each year to charitable causes. Zakat is a mandatory process for Muslims and is regarded as a form of worship.

Good Samaritan	A traveller is beaten up and robbed, and left for dead along the road. A priest comes by, but deliberately avoids the man. ... Finally, a Samaritan comes by, and he helps the injured man, in an act of mercy and compassion.

 <p>There are five rules that Muslims must follow to be faithful to their God. These are called the Five Pillars of Islam.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Faith in one God (Allah)</li> <li>2. Prayer 5 times a day facing Mecca</li> <li>3. Fasting during Ramadan</li> <li>4. Giving to charity (alms)</li> <li>5. Making a pilgrimage to Mecca once in a lifetime. (Hajj)</li> </ol> 	What rules to Christian follow	<p>Love God.</p> <p>Love your neighbour as yourself.</p> <p>Forgive others who have wronged you.</p> <p>Love your enemies.</p> <p>Ask God for forgiveness of your sins.</p> <p>Jesus is the Messiah and was given the authority to forgive others.</p> <p>Repentance of sins is essential.</p>		
	What rules to Muslims follow	<p>Shahadah: sincerely reciting the Muslim profession of faith.</p> <p>Salat: performing ritual prayers in the proper way five times each day.</p> <p>Zakat: paying an alms (or charity) tax to benefit the poor and the needy.</p> <p>Sawm: fasting during the month of Ramadan.</p> <p>Hajj: pilgrimage to Mecca.</p>
