
From my RE lessons: the Egyptians were people who lived a long time ago, the same time as the Old Testament stories of Moses.

Osiris	God of the Afterlife, associated with the River Nile	
Anubis	Jackal-headed god of mummification	
Sphinx	A creature with a lion's body and the head of a man, a ram or a bird.

artefact	An object from the past that shows evidence of what life was like.	
God/Goddess	Holy being, worshipped by people.	
pyramids and tombs	From 2650 to 244 BC pharaohs were buried in pyramids as a sign of their power and wealth. The pyramid could take over 20 years to build. After 2400 BC pharaohs were buried in tombs.	
afterlife	The belief in another life after the human death.

religion	The Egyptians believed that their world was controlled by the gods and huge temples were build to honour them.
