

There was a civilisation living in the area we now call Greece, approx.. 3000 years ago. This was a similar time to the Romans, Ancient Egyptians, and Bronze Age — all of which we have previously studied. These people lived in city states, but they could be very different to one another e.g. Athens and Sparta. Some of their beliefs and ways of life were similar to the Romans e.g. their Gods, homes, way of organising their society. Many of the words, architecture and ways we organise our societies today are based on Greek ideas, such as democracy. Much of what we know about Greek society comes from artefacts such as pots, buildings or writing.
